National Apprenticeship Week 6-12 February 2023

National Apprenticeship Week promotes how apprenticeships can help individuals to develop the skills and knowledge required for a rewarding career.

This month instead of focusing on a specific industry, this edition of Spotlight is going to look at Apprenticeships

What are the benefits of apprenticeships?

- Students can start at either 16 or 18 years
- Varying types of apprenticeships
- Apprenticeships offer hands on training
- Apprentices work alongside experienced staff
- Helps put skills into practice
- Apprentices are paid a salary and also holiday pay
- Have time for training and study relevant to the role

Conditions of applying for apprenticeships

- Must be 16 or over
- Must live in England
- Cannot be in full time education (although can still apply whilst at school)

What are the different types of apprenticeships?

- Intermediate Level 2
- Advanced Level 3
- Higher Level 4 or 5
- Degree Level 6 or 7

Apprenticeships also have equivalent educational levels i.e. Level 3 is equivalent to 2 or 3 A Levels, a Level 6 is equivalent to a Bachelor's degree and a Level 7 to a Masters
